PASTOR'S CORNER

My dear friends,

Presbyterian Pastor Rev. Dr. Peter Marshall, before the U.S. Senate. "Lord Jesus, thou who art the way, the truth, and the life; hear us as we pray for the truth that shall make all free. Teach us that liberty is not only to be loved but also to be lived. Liberty is too precious a thing to be buried in books. It costs too much to be hoarded. Help us see that our liberty is not the right to do as we please, but the opportunity to please to do what is right." At the time he said these words (1947) he had been serving as Chaplain to the Senate, a voice in the wilderness today, but when he said these words they were taken to heart.

It was a good prayer, and one I will think about this Saturday as we celebrate the Fourth of July. I just heard the beaches will be closed, which I think is a good idea. People are not going to gather in big groups, I hope, and so, this will be a very different holiday. MAYBE we can use it to reflect on our county, our values and people of faith, our priorities within our families and our community.

In a famous statement, French writer Alexis de Tocqueville, after visiting America in 1831, said, "I sought for the greatness of the United States in her commodious harbors, her ample rivers, her fertile fields, and boundless forests--and it was not there. I sought for it in her rich mines, her vast world commerce, her public school system, and in her institutions of higher learning--and it was not there. I looked for it in her democratic Congress and her matchless Constitution--and it

was not there. Not until I went into the churches of America and heard her pulpits flame with righteousness did I understand the secret of her genius and power. America is great because America is good, and if America ever ceases to be good, America will cease to be great!"

As people of faith, we look at things differently than many people, we see things other miss, feel things other avoid, and that is our calling.

I love the fireworks and the hot dogs and all that. I still tear up at patriotic songs, but this holiday is much more than that.

And so, on Sunday we will celebrate HOLY COMMUNION. What more appropriate observance of this holiday can there be, as we consider our Communion with God and our Communion with each other and our community. I cannot speak of other countries, but God has placed us and our church HERE in this place, this town, this state, this country, placed us NOW in this time of crisis with pandemic and civil unrest, and WHY God has done this we continue to explore.

The title of the sermon is "Proper Presbyterian Patriotism" and I look forward to sharing it with you.

2. Passed to hire Tim Murphy as our full time organist/pianist to replace Deb Fasanello as she retired this year.

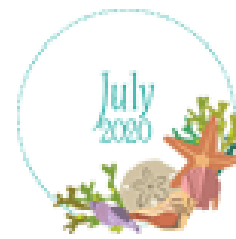
