#### "The heavens declare the glory of the Lord and the firmament proclaims His handiwork."

This is the opening verse of Psalm 19, which is one of my favorite Psalms in large part due to the "bookends" of the opening and closing verse.

If you have ever gazed upon the heavens at night and have seen the constellations and planets, or have had the awesome opportunity to be in a place so dark you can see the Milky Way, and have been awestruck at the sheer beauty of God's creation, then the opening verse to Psalm 19 becomes very personal. God has provided us with the opportunity to look up to the heavens and see His glory displayed in many ways.

In a few weeks, this glory will be displayed once again when the moon passes in front of the sun and blocks its light for a few minutes. This eclipse of the sun will take place on Monday, August 21st. While the path of totality will cross the entire United States, New Smyrna Beach will be in the 90% zone. While the shadow of the moon will not pass over our church, only 10 percent of the sun's light will be visible at the peak of the eclipse at 2:51 pm.

Solar eclipses have held special meaning in the life of the church. Several scriptures speak of the sun being darkened such as Amos 8:9; Micah 3:6; Zechariah 14:6; and Joel 2:10. Eclipses were regarded as tokens of God's anger as described in Joel 3:15 and Job 9:7. The darkness at the crucifixion of Christ as described in Matthew 27:45 has been ascribed to an eclipse, however the great intensity of darkness caused by an eclipse never lasts for more than six minutes, and this darkness lasted for three hours. Additionally, at the time of the Passover the moon was full, and therefore there could not be an eclipse of the sun, which is caused by an interposition of the moon between the sun and the earth when the moon is in its "New Moon" phase.

The last time our nation experienced an eclipse like this was 99 years ago. The one previous to that was in 1878. Our nation was just over a hundred years old, emerging from a Civil War and it took on a similar sensational nature to the one upcoming. In his book, "American Eclipse," author David Baron tells the story of the eclipse of 1878, its place in the growth of our nation and ends with the following statement, "Eclipses, I find, connect the present with the past like few other natural events....They afford a chance not only to grasp the majesty and power of nature, but to wonder at ourselves – who we are, and who we were when the same shadow long ago touched this finite orb in the boundless void."

However, the beauty and awesomeness of a total solar eclipse is unique to our special place in God's creation. The moon is just the right size to produce a total eclipse, but not totally obscure the full light of the sun. The corona, or outer regions, will be visible showing us just how complex and awesome our sun is. Nowhere else in the solar system is this visible. Either the body that passes in front of the sun is too small to produce a shadow or so big that it blocks out all of the light. Think about that for a moment. With both a solar and lunar eclipse, a portion of the light from the sun makes it through, never silencing the speech by day nor the knowledge by night, to paraphrase the psalmist.

I encourage all of you to take pause on the 21st and marvel at God's creation. Doing so safely, gaze upon the "crescent" sun and know that you hold a special place in God's creation. If you are able to experience the awe and wonder of the total eclipse, let the heavens declare the glory of the Lord. Know that even when the light of the sun is obscured by the moon, that it is only for a moment. Just as at the crucifixion, the Son was gone for a moment, but He rose again.

Psalm 19 ends with the verse, "May the words of my mouth and the meditations of our hearts be acceptable to you, O Lord, our rock and redeemer." May the awesomeness of the solar eclipse remind us of how the heavens declare the glory of the Lord and inspire and encourage us to go forth with words and meditations that are acceptable to our Lord as we continue to serve Him.

## **SESSION HIGHLIGHTS**

Session met on Thursday, July 27, 2017 and below are a few of the highlights of that meeting.

- 1. Heard a short report from representatives of the Pastor Nominating Committee that the Ministry Information Form (MIF) is complete and has been submitted, so they will begin receiving paperwork (Personal Information Forms – PIF) from candidates very shortly.
- 2. Reviewed the financial report from June. This months is a significant report because we are now halfway through the year. It is clear this is going to be another challenging financial year for us as we will be taking additional funds from reserves for operating expenses. We, as a Session and a congregation, have difficult decisions ahead, and we pray for the guidance of the Holy Spirit as we continue to remain faithful to God's call to be Christ's church to this community in 2017 and beyond.
- 3. Heard the report and some of the final details of Vacation Bible School which will be held in the evenings from July 31 to August 4. This wonderful ministry of outreach to our community is one that clearly shares our commitment to spreading the good news, love, and caring of Jesus. We look forward to joining the children and their families for a worship celebration and family picnic on August 6.
- 4. Received the report of the new cement drop-off and pick-up pad which has been installed on the north side of the parking lot for the safety and convenience of our congregation. The Building and Grounds Committee has developed a traffic pattern through the parking lot and will continue to develop the signage and education of the congregation regarding the process.
- 5. Approved for the Health Ministry to make arrangements to offer flu shots in the fall, when all of the details will be available. Additionally, blood pressure checks continue each month and we are grateful for our Health Ministry and their commitment to the physical health of our congregation.
- 6. Heard details of how our website, www.FirstPresbyterianNSB.com, continues to improve and Session encourages everyone to visit and see all of the information and items it contains. One of the new and important new items is our opportunity for online giving. Early in August everyone will be receiving an explanation on the specifics of online giving along with an individual mid-year financial statement.



# STAFF

I loved Sundays at church, hearing the organ and singing the liturgy and hymns. My first solo singing was at about age 11 from our church balcony and in duet with my friend Edwin in the sixth grade Christmas pageant. I sang in our high school vocal ensembles, played the role of Katisha in "The Mikado," played flute in concert band and orchestra, was captain of the marching band and honorary cadet captain of our Jr. ROTC Drum and Bugle Corps. It seemed only natural then that I would go to East Tennessee State University and major in music education.

At ETSU I studied hard, practiced, and performed with band, chorus, chamber choir, woodwind ensemble, and in recitals of the composition majors. As part of a scholarship I put in several hours a week doing secretarial work in the office of the Music Department Chairman. One day my piano teacher stepped into the office, commented on the rapidity of my typing, and said, "I never could learn to type because I always ended up playing chords on the typewriter!"

It was at ETSU that I met Jim King with the beautiful tenor voice. Jim and I were married before my senior year and after my graduation went to Boone, NC, where he pursued a master's degree at Appalachian State University. While at Appalachian, we met with a recruiter from the Harford County Maryland Public Schools, were hired for teaching positions, and moved to Maryland when Jim finished his graduate work.

Jim taught choral music at Aberdeen High School and directed the choirs at Grace United Methodist Church, which was our church home for many, many years. Because our daughter Laura arrived a month earlier than expected, I was in the hospital on the date our choir had planned a surprise baby shower -- which Jim attended alone. Twenty months later, our son Bradford arrived. So I was a stay-at-home mom, teaching private music lessons after school when Jim could be with our children.

With both children in school, I returned to the classroom and spent the next three summers at ETSU earning a master's degree. During the hours when I was in class, my parents kept the children at the music store, and it was such fun to see it all through their eyes.

I was appointed system-wide resource teacher for the staff of K-12, choral, instrumental, and general music, a position I held for 12 years. The purposes of that role were to facilitate improved instruction and to oversee curriculum development. It was a great period of growth for me as I'm sure I learned from them much more than I gave them.

I completed additional post-graduate studies at Loyola College in Maryland, the Peabody Conservatory of Johns Hopkins University, and Towson University. The last 15 years in school systems - Harford County and then Howard County - were spent supervising and coordinating music programs. One of the greatest joys among the many responsibilities of the job was interviewing and recommending for hire so many bright young teacher candidates. In the 1990s I served a six-year term as president -elect, president, and immediate past president of the Maryland Music Educators Association; and God blessed me with numerous opportunities to teach students in pre-kindergarten through master's programs.

After 33 years in public schools, I retired and spent the next seven working with the Maryland State Department of Education to develop fine arts standards and provide staff development throughout the state on standards implementation. Through the years I was honored to serve as clinician, guest conductor, and adjudicator in Maryland, Virginia, Pennsylvania, and Florida and to sing and play in numerous venues. It has been an overwhelming blessing to meet and work with so many talented and committed professionals throughout a long career.

With years of happy memories behind, I can honestly say that being here at First Presbyterian and directing the wonderful Chancel Choir and Summer Singers is among the most rewarding of all. I thank God every day for this opportunity and for the many special friendships I have formed here.

This would be incomplete without the acknowledgement that I am blessed beyond measure to be mother to Laura and Brad, mother-in-law to Charlie and Angie, and Grandma Babs to Charlie, Kate, Miles, Gabriel, Ethan, and Anson.

# **HEALTH MINISTRY**

### **Health Ministry**

AED, what does this sign mean?

Have you noticed a new sign in Fellowship Hall with these letters? This sign signifies that there is an AED in this room for use in an emergency.

An automated external defibrillator (AED) is a <u>portable electronic device</u> that automatically diagnoses the life-threatening <u>cardiac arrhythmias</u> of <u>ventricular</u> <u>fibrillation</u> and <u>pulseless ventricular tachycardia</u> in a <u>patient</u>, <sup>ßl</sup> and is able to treat them through <u>defibrillation</u>, the application of electrical therapy which stops the arrhythmia, allowing the heart to reestablish an effective rhythm.

An AED is "automatic" because of the unit's ability to autonomously analyze the patient's condition. Our unit has spoken prompts and visual displays to instruct the user.

"External" refers to the fact that the operator applies the electrode pads to the bare <u>chest</u> of the victim.

When turned on or opened, the AED will instruct the user to connect the electrodes (pads) to the patient. The pads allow the AED to examine the electrical output from the heart and determine if the patient is in a shockable rhythm (either ventricular fibrillation or ventricular tachycardia). If the device determines that a shock is warranted, it will use the battery to charge its internal capacitor in preparation to deliver the shock. This system is not only safer (charging only when required), but also allows for a faster delivery of the electric current.

If there is ever an emergency within the church <u>CALL 911</u> and send someone to obtain the AED out of the box in Fellowship Hall. An alarm will sound, but just grab the box and bring it to the emergency site.

If you would like training regarding the use of the AED or hands only CPR please call the church office, 386-428-2397. A training session will be schedule with sufficient numbers.


### SEW FOR JESUS




### <u>NEWMAN'S CREWMEN</u>

Daily Walk Bible Reading Start now and read the Bible in a year.


Do you know?? Do you know that the Old Testament points directly toward the New Testament and the Good News of the Gospel of our Lord Jesus Christ?
