

### **SESSION HIGHLIGHTS**

Session met on Thursday, September 28, 2017 and a few of the highlights are listed below:

- 1. Approved Rev. Dr. Robert "Bob" Anderson as our bridge pastor from October 8, 2017, until a permanent pastor is here. He moderated the Session Meeting and it was good to begin to get to know him.
- 2. Received the report on the Stewardship Campaign which will begin on Sunday, October 1, 2017. The four weekly themes are Living, Loving, Giving, and Growing. Dedication Sunday is October 29, 2017.
- 3. Reviewed the Financial Report, where our income is about 20% below budget and our expenses are about 10% below budget. Session continues to look for ways to reduce expenses to be closer to income and therefore reduce the need to take as much from our reserve funds.
- 4. The Health Ministry has arranged for flu shots will be given on Sunday, October 15, 2017, from 8:30 to 12:30 at the church. They are free for those with Medicare, will file insurance for those who have it, and the cost is \$30 for those without insurance.
- 5. We will once again be the Drop Off / Relay Center for Operation Christmas Child in this area. Empty boxes are available to be picked up anytime at the church and filled ones will be received through November 19, 2017.
- 6. Our Christmas Cantata will be held on Sunday, December 17, at 10:00 a.m. and our Christmas Worship Service will be held on Sunday, December 24, at 10:00 a.m. More details coming!
- 7. Discussed ways in which our congregation, corporately and individually, can respond to those trying to recover from recent Hurricanes Irma and Maria. Information, including a list of items being collected, will be provided in the Good News Newsletter and the weekly bulletins.
- 8. Elected Anne Perdue as the Commissioner to the Central Florida Presbytery Meeting in Vero Beach on Thursday, October 12.

WELCOME! To Rev. Dr. Robert "Bob" Anderson!

On October 8, 2017, we'll welcome Rev. Bob Anderson to our pulpit and to ministry with us until we have a permanent pastor. This transition time, from having a full-time long term interim to a permanent pastor, is called a bridge or gap time. Bridge Pastor may be a new term to many of us and is meant to be a short term pastor who will "bridge" us, so we are welcoming Bob as a Bridge Pastor.

Since this is something new for us, we're going to live it out together. Bob will have pastoral responsibilities especially focused on preaching and leading Sunday worship, as well as congregational care with visitation. He'll be working with the congregation, Elders, and Deacons to ensure we continue to be ready to receive a new permanent pastor.

As we begin this transition, Bob will be here on Sundays, Wednesdays, and other times when we need him.

From 1973 to 2001, Bob served two congregations in western Pennsylvania, when he and his wife, Diane, relocated to Daytona Beach where he served United Presbyterian Church from 2001 until his retirement in 2015. Since then he has been preaching and teaching in Daytona and Port Orange.

  - Personal hygiene items soap, deodorant, toothpaste
  - First Aid Kit, general medicines (ibuprofen, etc.), medical supplies



### **OUTREACH**



New Smyrna Beach Drop Off Site: We have served as the drop off site for the past 2 years and have once again been asked to for the 2017 Campaign! In addition, I was asked to serve as the Area Student Relations Coordinator beginning January 2018. This will be an exciting time to offer training and the skills needed to our younger generation to serve in a community and worldwide outreach effort. I am humbled at this opportunity and look forward to serving with this ministry.

The story of the Good Samaritan (Luke 10:30-37) gives a clear picture of God's desire for us to help those in desperate need wherever we find them. After describing how the Samaritan rescued a hurting man whom others had passed by, Jesus told His hearers, "Go and do likewise." For over 40 years, Samaritan's Purse has done our utmost to follow Christ's command by going to the aid of the world's poor, sick, and suffering. We are an effective means of reaching hurting people in countries around the world with food, medicine, and other assistance in the Name of Jesus Christ. This, in turn, earns us a hearing for the Gospel, the Good News of eternal life through Jesus Christ.

As our teams work in crisis areas of the world, people often ask, "Why did you come?" The answer is always the same: "We have come to help you in the Name of the Lord Jesus Christ." The kids went wild and were so excited that they met the goal were able to help 109 kids and of course 'slime' Ms. Ann Marie...wait it didn't end there. The kids came in on Thurs. evening with even more offerings to give and so I added a youth to be slimed with me. In total on Friday evening we raised \$350, what a won-



Currently we have raised a little over half of the funds needed to hire a full time staff to oversee and get this club started. Currently I am serving in training of all the administrative and start up procedures necessary to begin this club, working directly with the regional and local area directors.



#### Edgewater/New Smyrna Beach Club:

Our church joins with ministries to serve Indian River Elementary School every Wednesday (beginning Oct. 11<sup>th</sup>) from 1p -2:30p. We have approx. 50 kids from Kindergarten thru 5<sup>th</sup> grade. I serve as a trained TCE 1 Level teacher through Child Evangelism Fellowship.

**About:** Child Evangelism Fellowship is a Bible-centered organization composed of born-again believers whose purpose is to evangelize boys and girls with the Gospel of the Lord Jesus Christ and to establish (disciple) them in the Word of God and in a local church for Christian living.

### CEF has many different ministries for children, but the primary ones are the Good News Club and the 5-Day Club.



The Good News Club and 5-Day Club ministries take place in neighborhood settings such as homes, backyards, schools and community centers all over the world. These fast-paced, one-hour programs are designed to bring the Gospel of Christ to children on their level in their environment.

Along with these clubs, *CEF* also has fair, camping, open-air, and internet ministries for children. Last year through these combined ministries over 19.8 million children worldwide heard the Good News.
