#### A New Pastor!

For I know the plans I have for you, declares the Lord, plans to prosper you and not to harm you, plans to give you hope and a future. Jeremiah 29:11

With a unanimous vote during a Congregational Meeting on Sunday, November 19, First Presbyterian Church of New Smyrna Beach voted to call a new pastor, Rev. George T. Head. This was the culmination of nearly three years of uncertainty; not knowing where the church was going or how we would get there without an installed pastor. Yet God had a person and plan and the congregation remained faithful until the time the Pastor Nominating Committee, also remaining faithful, listened and followed the leading of the Holy Spirit as the path was made clear, the person God had chosen was identified, and the next portion of God's plan began to unfold.

Following the motion to call Rev. Head, the congregation watched a presentation that included Rev. Head's biography, experience, ministry style, activities, and interests. Each of the slides was enhanced by personal comments and insights from a member of our Pastor Nominating Committee.

George was born and raised in southern Florida with music being an important part of his life and worship expression. He graduated from Jacksonville University with a degree in music performance (Opera and Cello) and music continues to be an integral part of his life and ministry. He attended Columbia Seminary in Georgia and began his ordained ministry as an Associate Minister at Peachtree Presbyterian, our denomination's largest congregation, in Atlanta. He comes to us from serving a congregation in Palatka, Florida and in between those, he has served with congregations in Auburndate, Florida, and Columbia, South Carolina.

New Smyrna Beach is now home to George, wife Debra, a reading teacher at New Smyrna Beach High School, and son Wilson, an honor student and soccer player at NSBHS. Another son, Michael, lives in Nashville, Tennessee. George and Debra are grandparents to Harvey, born last year to son Kirby and his wife Rose, who live in Jackson-ville. George continues to enjoy playing the cello and is an avid bicyclist, having crossed 31 states by bike! He and Debra enjoy kayaking locally and traveling to many different countries.

A portion of George's Statement of Faith includes, "I believe in one just, holy, and eternal God, who created the world and all that is in it intentionally, and for a purpose...God is revealed to us through creation, through scripture, and most clearly through the person of Jesus; the only begotten son of God...He has redeemed the world and broken the power of sin and death. By his resurrection, we are born into the promise of eternal life with God...Through the guidance of the Holy Spirit, we study scripture, pray, worship, and minister to others, living out the good news of the Gospel message... Through the power of the Holy Spirit, God continues the work of reconciliation through the church...The church is the open door that is wiling and ready to minister to the needs of humankind."

This article includes a small portion of the information shared and there are packets in the church office with some more detail. The joyful part for us is that we are in the very beginning of getting to know Rev. Head, Debra, and Wilson as people, not simply information on a page or in a presentation. The future is bright as we begin to share in ministry together in this congregation and in our community.

### **SESSION HIGHLIGHTS**

#### NOVEMBER MEETING

On November 16, 2017, the Deacons and Ruling Elders met for an annual joint meeting. It was a time of fellowship, as well as questions and answers, explanations, clarifications, and excitement about the new and renewing opportunities for ministry and mission of our congregation. Following the meeting, both the Deacons and Session met separately for the regular monthly meetings.

- 1. Session heard the report from the Treasurer that, in October, our church's excess of expenses over revenues was only \$1737, which is much improved over previous months. There are multiple reasons for the improvement, including having fine (5) Sundays in the month, increased congregational giving, and fewer pastoral expenses.
- 2. Heard a report from the Finance Committee of the very positive response of the congregation to this year's Stewardship program with increased giving and pledges for 2018.
- 3. Approved a Christmas Eve Candlelight Worship Service of Lessons and Carols for Sunday, December 24, with Tim Murphy at the piano.
- 4. Approved a program of sharing Christmas cards with one another in the congregation on December 3<sup>rd</sup>, 10<sup>th</sup>, and 17<sup>th</sup>.
- 5. Heard a report from the Fellowship Committee of each of the activities included with our Fellowship Time following worship during the month of December. Session is looking forward to many people participating.
- 6. Approved a special music program, led by Charlie King, for Sunday afternoon, February 18, 2018, at 3:00 PM in the sanctuary. The program, entitled "Name That Song" is free, open to the public, and will be an enjoyed by all.

# **PASTOR'S CORNER**

To All the Saints at FPC:



**Black Friday** has become "Black Week" or Black Month" over the years. Each year the Christmas shopping gets earlier and longer! It started with getting to the stores early on the Friday after Thanksgiving; then it shifted to Thanksgiving evening; and now it is going on all week—or, at least, the previews of the Black Friday sales are going on the last two weeks leading up to the traditional Black Friday.

"Shouldn't it be called 'Black Friday' or some other somber designation?" Of course, it is called "Good Friday" because Jesus' resurrection follows his death, and we know that the doorway to God's good life is crucifixion/resurrection.

Advent and Christmas and Epiphany is such a season of joy that it is a shame that the color to start it off is black! All other colors are much more in keeping with the angel's announcement to the shepherds outside Bethlehem on that first Christmas day!

"Don't be afraid. I'm here to announce a great and joyful event that is meant for everybody, worldwide. A Savior has just been born in David's town, a Savior who is Messiah and Master. This is what you're to look for: a baby wrapped in a blanket and lying in a manger."

This announcement was followed with an angelic choir singing

"Glory to God in the heavenly heights, Peace to all men and women on earth who please him." (Luke 2:12-14 The Message)

But, black is the color of the hoped for "bottom line" for businesses, and sadly that blackness often is allowed to overshadow the true meaning of Christmas. There wouldn't be a "Black Friday" as we know it if there wasn't a birth in Bethlehem for there would be no presents to buy. There wouldn't be a Good Friday or Easter if there wasn't a birth in Bethlehem. Paul's words in 1 Corinthians 15:17 would be sadly, bleakly true. "If Christ has not been raised, your faith is futile and you are still in your sins."

There are a lot of layers, like the layers of an onion, to peel away to get to the core of our Christmas/ Easter faith. It takes work to strip away the things standing between ourselves and the meaning of Christmas. Christmas sales are certainly one layer. The outlandish busyness of this season is another. The height of joy felt by many people when inside many are crying is another one. But, once we cut through it all and come to the central, eternal truth about Christmas, we find the blessing is incredible! But, the hope we find in the Christmas birth cannot be separated from the Good Friday death and Easter's resurrection. For the resurrection confirms the hopes and dreams present in the birth and life of Jesus. All that was hoped for in the birth of the Messiah; all the things Jesus did and said that brought abundant life to people; all the things Jesus said about being loved and forgiven; all that Jesus did to show us the true nature of God were ratified and verified in his resurrection. Easter's resurrection is God's mighty stamp of approval on the life and death of Jesus!



#### THE POWER OF PRAYER

Each week in the Sunday bulletin and each month in the *Good News* Newsletter there is a section that invites people to send prayer requests to Ed Perdue at his e-mail address. What happens once he receives the prayer request? He sends it out to those on the Prayer Chain, they check their e-mail and pray for whatever is requested. 



importance of giving. Still, others provided for the cost of shipping the cartons


